## Educational Case Review

### Medication Selection for Patients on Ketogenic Diets

SK is a 16 month old boy admitted to hospice with a primary diagnosis of Sandhoff disease. He has a history of epilepsy and malnutrition and weighs 11.2kg (24.8 lbs). SK has been on and off service since he was 9 months old and has no other health conditions or known drug allergies. He lives at home with his parents and 2 older sisters.

Seizures are a common complication of Sandhoff disease and SK was initiated on a ketogenic diet to help manage them. In accordance with the diet, many liquid medications were switched to tablet dosage forms to limit the amount of carbohydrates. SK is prescribed glycerin suppositories as needed for constipation, however glycerin is not recommended for patients on [...] [Continue reading](#)

## Hospice-Appropriate Universal Precautions for Opioid Safety

Universal precautions for opioid safety, similar to universal precautions for infection control, is one approach to addressing the epidemic of prescription pain medication misuse that some pain clinics, primary care practices, and hospices have used.
