Based on extensive archival work, *Stormtrooper Families* examines the stormtrooper movement from 1923-1933 and reveals it as an organic product of its local community, its web of interpersonal relationships, and its intensely emotional internal struggles. As children in the late-imperial period, the stormtroopers witnessed the first German debates over homosexuality and political life. As young adults, they verbally and physically battled over these definitions, bringing conflicts over homosexuality and masculinity into the center of Weimar Germany's most important political debates. *Stormtrooper Families* chronicles personal, political, and sexual struggles to explain not only how gay men existed within the Nazi movement but also how the public meaning of homosexuality affected fascist and antifascist politics.
